### UKRAINIAN GRAFTERS SENTENCED TO DEATH

Kharkov, Russia, Oct. 7. (By Mail)—The Ukraino soviet government has been making strenuous efforts to break up the practice of graft and bribery among state employees, and in this connection a trial ended recently in which the two accused principals, M. Meletensky, director of the state trading department, and his agent, Bakhmoutsky, were sentenced to be shot.

The prosecution charged that Meletensky and Bakhmoutsky by an ingenious and extensive system of bribery and graft in disposing of state timber from one government department to another, had cleaned up some 20,000,000,000 soviet rubles, amounting at the time to about \$50,000.
