The starch was taken out of the visitors on the second play from scrimmage, when Gardner Lam-ber recovered a fumble and raced forty yards for a touchdown. On the kick-off, Blakely made first down, but failed on four line attempts to annex the necessary ten yards and the ball went over. Lindsey ran thir-ty yards through a broken field. Sin

gleiary hit the line for nine yards and Stacey added eight more. Stacey got five, Lindsey two more and Lambert three for first down. Boiret, for the visitors recovered a forward pass on the ten-yard line when Lindsey jusgled the ball, but the bell went over to Thomasville again on the thirteen yard line. Lindsey promptly got eight around end and Lambert bucked the ball over.

Blakely made two first downs on the next kick-off and Singletary inter-cepted a forward pass, making ten yards on the play before he was down ed. The ball was on the thirty-yard line when the second quarter opened in Thomasville's possession. After falling to gain, Thomasville punted over the goal line. Blakely brought the ball out to the twenty-yard line and failing to make ten yards in three downs, punted. Thomasville returned ten yards while Stacey, Ractord Sin-gletary and Lambert shoved it across after a series of line plays and end runs. Stacey got credit for the touch down, Bingletary bloked a goal. Blakely Bucks Up.

Here Blakely bucked up wonder-fully and took the ball down the field after a kick-off to the ten, yard line where the ball went over on an incomplete forward pass after four trys for a todehdown, ending the half. It took Lindsey ten seconds to race sixty-five yards for a touchdown the second half on the first play after the kickoff, Nobody was anywhere near him when he crossed the line. This was one of the longest scrim nage plays of the entire season.

Blakely ran the ball, after kick-off, down the field to the four yard line and there tried to buck it over. Four attempts on the line tailed miserably, the players being piled up regularly every time they started with the ball. assville then ran from behind th goal line. Mays who had come into the game at fullback, hit the line on a fake punt, like a steam engine for eleven, twelve and nine yards. Lindsey got eight around end and then carried the ball thirty-five yards to the eighteen yard line on a clever end run. In the fourth quarter the locals threw a forward pass to the three-yard line and Mays bucked it over,

In this quarter King kicked a perfect field goal for the visitors for their ione tally. This attempt came on fourth down after they had failed to gain an inch on three plays through the line. Lindsey and Singletary added long runs in this period and indsey carried the ball over from the bree-yard line on a triple pass, being entirely away from any of the visiting players, who falled to disgnose the play, presumably looking for a line attack. Biakely fumbled near midfield after the kick off and Washingn grabbed the ball and made the final touchdown for the local team, running forty yards.
