DAILY DOPE

As usual some are saying that two of the five touchdowns made by the Bull Dogs yesterday were luck pure and simple, but it is not luck for a team to recover every fumble another football team makes in a game and that is exactly what happened yesterday. Tifton fumbled frequently but it was due to the drive of the Bull Dog line that had the backs hurrying through the plays and made them a trifle butler fingered. The Tifton team is a good team but the Bull Dogs are a rather great team for a high school in a city this size.

Albany beat Moultrie 13 to 0 yesterday and Valdosta beat Waycross 40 to 6 in a runaway affair. This was a very interesting game. Pickett defeated the Cairo team 26 to 0, continuing to show the drive that has featured the other contests this season played by that team.

There was no one hurt in the game yesterday and the team should be in prime shape for one of the biggest games of the season in Albany next Friday. Reports from the Albany-Moultrie game are that the Indians have improved vastly since the memorable Valdosta game and are on a par with the Bull Dogs. The most of the fans seem to think that it will be a toss up as to which team will win the game. The dope runs something like this: Albany defeated Ocala 28 to 0; Ocala beat Tifton and the Bull Dogs 13 to 0. This gives the Bull Dogs a slight advantage. Another angle is this: Tifton and Moultrie played a 0 to 0 tie last week, Albany defeated Moultrie 13 to 0 yesterday and the Bull Dogs defeated Tifton 21 to 0. This too shows the Bull Dogs a trifle superior to the Indians in scoring ability but it will have to be taken into consideration that Albany was playing away from home yesterday and the Bull Dogs were at home. This always makes a difference in a high school team as witness the Sylvester game last week. It may make a difference in Albany next week.

The crowd was better at the game yesterday and the cheering was spirited. Tifton brought down fifty or sixty fans who altho disappointed in the defeat of their team were almost unanimous in saying that the Bull Dogs had the greatest machine they have seen this year. This praise of the team may sound a little overdone but it is not anyone who saw the game will say the same.

There remain only two undefeated teams in the conference, Thomasville and Valdosta. Whether Albany's plan of defeating the Bull Dogs next week and then the Bull Dogs defeating Valdosta will work out or not remains to be seen. There is a very good chance of the Bull Dogs losing the game next week but there is an equally good chance for them to win it.

BULLDOGS OUTPLAY BLUE DEVILS FOR 31-0 VICTORY

Much Vaunted Tifton Aggregation Outclassed in Fast Game Here Yesterday.

Showing a complete reversal of form over their poor showing in Sylvester last week, the Bulldogs ran rough shod over the Tifton Blue Devils yesterday the final score being 31 to 0. Three touchdowns were scored in the first quarter of the game.

The much vaunted Tifton passing attack and running attack was stopped dead yesterday. The Bulldogs only making five first downs during the entire afternoon to 14 for the Bulldogs. The local line was charging hard and low yesterday and literally swept the Tifton line back into the ball carriers domain and caused the backs to fumble repeatedly. Coach Harper told the line men during the halves yesterday that "you are playing the greatest game I have ever seen a high school line play." This in a measure shows how the line was charging for Coach Harper is not given to compliments as a usual thing.

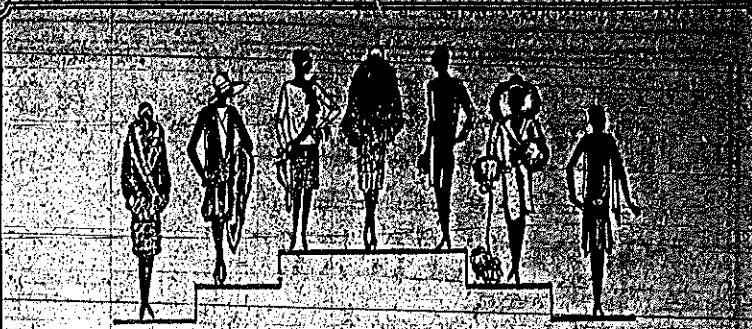
Petty was up to his old tricks yesterday and although he played in less than half of the game scintillated while playing. In the first three minutes of the game he broke off his own right tackle and ran 45 yards to the Tifton three yard line. It was as good an exhibition of broken field running as has been seen here in many moons. He had perfect interference to follow, also. Vaughn, Pugh and Mauldin and Bert Drake all did their share of the ball carrying and more. Pugh was not called upon to do the enormous task of all of the ball carrying as in Sylvester, but when he did he never failed to gain and was a power on defense. Sam Drake made several nice gains as did Vaughn. Mauldin continued his sensational return of the punts and ran the team well throughout the game.

To pick out the star in the line would mean to pick out a power man and saying the same of each, and that is that each played superb football and nothing more could be asked. Patterson and Floyd held down the flank positions in unusual line style, while Milton and Pickett at the tackles were charging hard and could not be thrown back. Pete Drake continued to star as in the Sylvester game. He recovered a fumble and ran fifty yards for a touchdown on one play and never failed to break through the Tifton line. Reeves was equally as good. Big Braswell, a comparatively new man at center made a great impression on the fans and players with his stellar work at the pivot position. He was always in the play of the Tifton offense and his passing was perfect. This boy will be a star before the season is over if he continues to play as in yesterday's game.

The second team was sent into the game in the latter part of the third quarter and when the game ended, Crawford, Young, Petty, and Pugh pushed the ball deep into Tifton territory. Only the whistle saved the second team from scoring on the Blue Devils.

Captain Milton won the toss and elected to receive. Captain England, Tifton star took the west goal. Petty took the kickoff and returned it twenty yards. On three plays Vaughn and Petty made first down through the line and on the next play Petty broke off right tackle, reversed the field and ran forty-five yards to the Tifton three yard line. He took over on the next play, Pugh failed to kick a goal. On Petty's run, every Thomasville player knocked a Tifton man off his feet and the interference was perfect. Petty kicked off to Tifton and after failing to make first down England punted to Mauldin. The Bulldogs could not make a first down and Pugh punted to England. The ball was in Tifton's possession on the own 45 yard line. After one play England fumbled and Pete Drake, right guard for the Bulldogs, broke through lips a shot out of a gun and received. He ran 55 yards for a touchdown, not a man tackling him before he crossed the goal. Pugh again failed to kick the goal.

After Petty had kicked off to Tifton the Blue Devils made a first down by an off side penalty and two short gains through the line. Pugh then drove a Tifton fumble and raced forty yards for a touchdown. He failed to kick goal. Petty kicked off to Tifton again and the quarter ended after both teams had failed to make a first down. The ball was in Thomasville's possession. Tom Petty and Vaughn rushed the ball all the way down the field mainly through the Tifton tackles for another touchdown. The

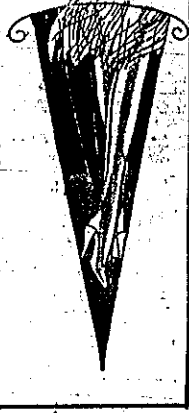

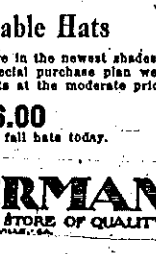
