CHARLES BRYAN FACES RECALL AS MAYOR OF LINCOLN, NEBRASKA
Lincoln, Neb., Oct. 24 (AP)—Charles W. Bryan, three times governor of Nebraska and brother of William Jennings Bryan, the commoner, faced the possibility of recall as mayor of Lincoln today.
Petition asking his recall, allegedly bearing 6500 qualified signatures, four more than the number necessary for a recall election, were filed with the city clerk yesterday.
Bryan said the action did not surprise him, as he had heard reports for the last few months that recall petitions were being circulated.
Friends of Bryan said the efforts to recall the mayor were pressed by persons whom the city council had refused to hear.
Bryan characterized the petitions "a protest against the policy of law enforcement and responsible regulation of beer and liquor."

AMERICANS RECEIVE 43 PER CENT OF PRIZES IN THE IRISH SWEEPSTAKES

Dublin, Irish Press, Oct. 24 (AP) - Americans received more than 43 per cent of the prizes today in the first round of the 14th drawing of the Irish Hospital Sweepstakes.

The draw was postponed for four days because of the outbreak of the influenza epidemic which had swept across almost all the country on the day before.

The names of only 150 of the first five prizes were drawn at a time. The first prize was \$100,000. The second prize was \$25,000. The third prize was \$10,000. The fourth prize was \$5,000. The fifth prize was \$2,500.
