BAINBRIDGE—Thomasville High's Bulldogs generated enough offensive brilliance to get off to a two-touchdown lead, then they put their best defensive foot forward to ease by a stubborn and tired up band of Bainbridge Bears, 18-6, here last night.

The Bulldogs came to Bainbridge expecting a tough ball game—and they got it. Nevertheless, they came back the next day to notch their fifth straight win this season, and their 16th triumph in a row in regular season play since the first game of 1954.

But more important was the fact that they captured their first 1-A-A (South) mark for the year to a still perfect 2-0 standard.

It was the second loss in five starts for the Bears. They now have a 2-3-1 overall mark. This was their final league game of the 1956 season, and they finished their 1-A-A (South) slate with a 2-3 rating.

Renior fullback Joel Arrington led the Bulldogs to a 2-0 touch-down lead. On the third play of the game he galloped 68 yards for a score. In the second period he was again in the back field to climax a 68-yard Thomasville march.

Called on to run with the ball 10 times, the 175-pound Arrington was stopped by Bainbridge's defense from the start and speedy Bear defensive force for 136 yards. The Bears' defense was a lot better than that of the 253 yards the Bulldogs were able to make.
