

OVER BAINBRIDGE

Morris, Lamb, Williams Pace Thomasville's 28-0 Victory

By GEORGE LASSITER, THE Sports Editor. BAINBRIDGE was homecoming in Bainbridge and the first half defensive effort by the Bearcats and halftime ceremonies were enjoyable for the Bainbridge supporters and alumni.

But, beginning late in the third quarter, Willie Morris, Johnny Williams and David Lamb followed some excellent offensive blocking to give the Thomasville High Bulldogs a 28-0 victory over the Bearcats here last night before a small crowd.

THOMASVILLE GRABBED a 6-0 halftime lead and did not cross the Bainbridge goal line again until 2:16 remaining in the third quarter.

The victory was the fifth straight for the Bulldogs against an opening loss to Valdosta, while the Bearcats dropped their fourth consecutive game against a win and tie.

Brooks Wins 6th Straight Game

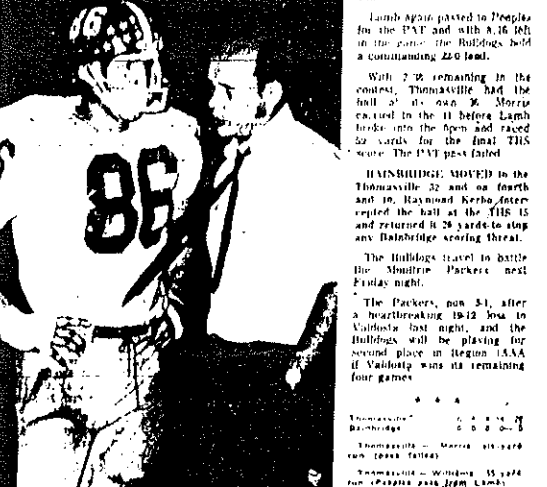
OTTAWA — Doug Singletary accounted for half of the Brooks County points as the Trojans scored in their sixth straight victory of the season without a defeat here last night.
